Our Annual GIMI Board Meeting Was A Time Of Thanksgiving and Renewed Vision!

On Friday evening, June 21, 2019, our GIMI Board of Directors held our annual meeting with eleven of our twelve members present. One person couldn't come due to illness. The meeting was just one of the best meetings that we have had in 20 years. Many updates on the ministry were given, many reports were adopted, and a brand new budget was approved for our next fiscal year. The budget we projected is **\$640,878.28**. This includes our general operating budget and the budget for working in nine African countries and the Ukraine. Now, I do hope that all of you might sincerely pray about helping us reach this budget so that the work can go on winning men, women, boys, and girls to Jesus. By the way, this new budget also includes the new work in the South Sudanese Refugee Camp in northern Uganda. We are really hoping to reach a lot of these suffering people and minister to them as much as God might provide. The work has already begun in a great way. Many souls have already been saved. We are truly excited about seeing what God is going to do in this new field of service.

I also want to remind you that back in 2015, just before I got so sick, we were then working in 15 African countries, and truthfully, I am sincerely praying that God might provide the extra funds so that we can re-expand this ministry to the countries where we have already worked, and hopefully, be able to walk through some of the new doors that are opening for this ministry. Please help us pray that we might even go far beyond our budget of **\$640,878.28**, in order to see thousands more

And, believe it or not, we have distributed over 24 million dollars worth of humanitarian assistance, with the help of Samaritan's Purse which provided the necessary equipment to restore three prison hospitals in Uganda, Kenya, and Ghana, West Africa. Only God knows just how many physical lives have been saved through the food, the clothing, the medicine, the doctor's clinics, the medical equipment, blankets, and most of all, the scores and scores of souls that have been given an eternal home in heaven because they got gloriously saved. I am almost shouting, but it is Monday morning when I am writing, and no preacher should be shouting on Monday! Amen! Amen! Well, just praise the Lord! Hallelujah!

OUR GIMI 20TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION WAS A GLORIOUS EXPERIENCE!

On Saturday evening, June 22, 2019, our GIMI Board of Directors and almost 50 guests had the privilege of celebrating our 20th Anniversary as a missions ministry. We had friends here from as far away as northern Ohio and many other places. We also were privileged to have as our guest speaker, our Vice-president, Dr. Tommy Snyder, and his wife, Joyce, who came all the way from Batesville, Mississippi. Pastor Tommy just did a wonderful job encouraging all of our GIMI Board Members and friends to really get involved in missions in an attempt to win people to Christ in these last days just before the return of our Lord. He used Psalm 126 as his Bible text to challenge us. Also, he shared about how God gloriously worked during his recent March trip to Kenya. During the ten days that he was there, preaching in my place, over 1,300 people prayed to receive Christ as their personal Savior. I also want to thank God for the delicious meal that was served for us by the Boxcar Grille located in Claremont, North Carolina. It was just marvelous, and there was plenty for everyone to enjoy. We also appreciate so much Estelle McKinney and Howard and Jackie Tevepaugh. They did a wonderful job greeting our guests and helping to serve the tables. I heard many people say, "It was such a delightful evening of fellowship and worship!"

I sincerely wish that all of you on our support team could have been here to celebrate with us. But, please know that we are planning some more of these wonderful evenings in the future.

WE CAME TO SEEK + SAVE THE LOST

Wonderful Testimony Of Pastor Michael Too

My name is Michael Too from Kenya, East Africa. I am fifty-seven years old, and I am born again! I am married to a lovely wife—Mrs. Martha Michael and blessed with five grown-up children—three boys and two daughters. I am working with the Disciples Of Mercy, which is a Christian organization based here in Kenya as a coordinator for the prison project.

I am an ex-inmate having been arrested in March, 2005, and later, the same year convicted to serve ten years imprisonment after being charged with robbery with violence, which carries a death sentence, but was lucky to have been sentenced to serve ten years.

After being convicted, I was taken to Naivasha Maximum Security Prison, and while in this prison I was confused and stressed to a point of death, due to the fact that I would not go back alive. I was in the same condition for seven months.

Then in 2006, Dr. Stan Frye, his wife, Jo Anne, Pastor Sammy Mbugua, and the rest of the team came to minister to us and this was the day I gave my life to Jesus Christ. My life never remained the same again. The team blessed us with Bibles and Christian books, including the Purpose Driven Life, by Rick Warren. After reading it with the quoted Bible verses, I realized that I still had a bright future.

I would like to thank God for bringing Gateway International Missions, led by Dr. Stan, into my life. May God richly bless you is my sincere prayer.

Thank you so much for all that you have done for me, both in prison, and after prison, especially for having been among the team who escorted me home. Through Pastor Sammy Mbugua, GIMI bought me a Lap Top computer, bricks for my local church, among many other blessings you have accorded me and my family.

Let me say also a big thank you for the wonderful work and support for prisoners around the world, especially in Africa. Let me not forget to thank Pastor Sammy for the good work and also for allowing me to meet Pastor Tommy Snyder in Nairobi, Kenya, in March of this year. Thanks so much, Pastor Tommy, for sparing a few minutes of your busy schedule to meet with me in Nairobi.

Finally to the entire ministry staff and the sponsors, may God bless you all for the wonderful work you are doing for those many men and women in prisons around the world. May God reward you in a very special way!

Wonderful Testimony Of Pastor Emmanuel Mutegeri

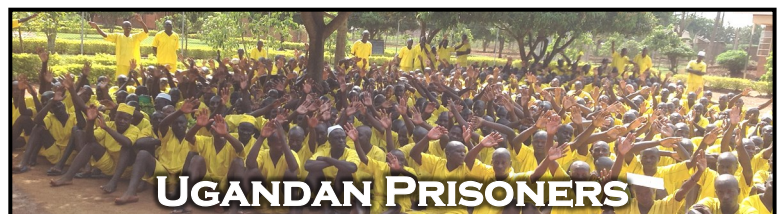

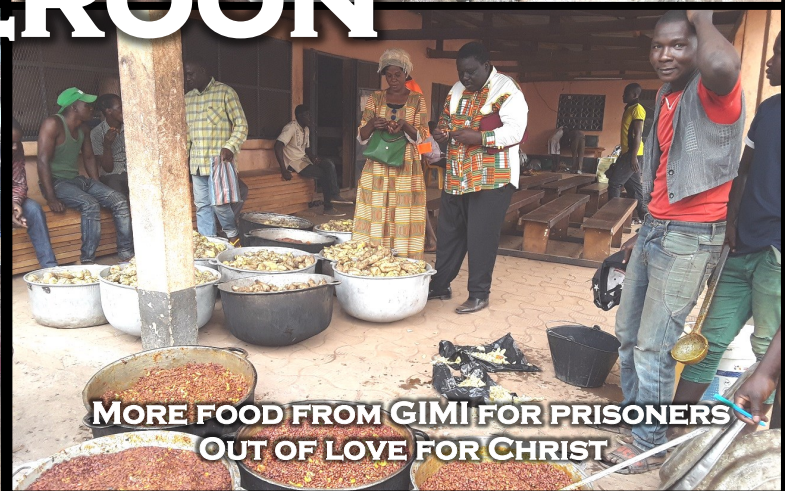

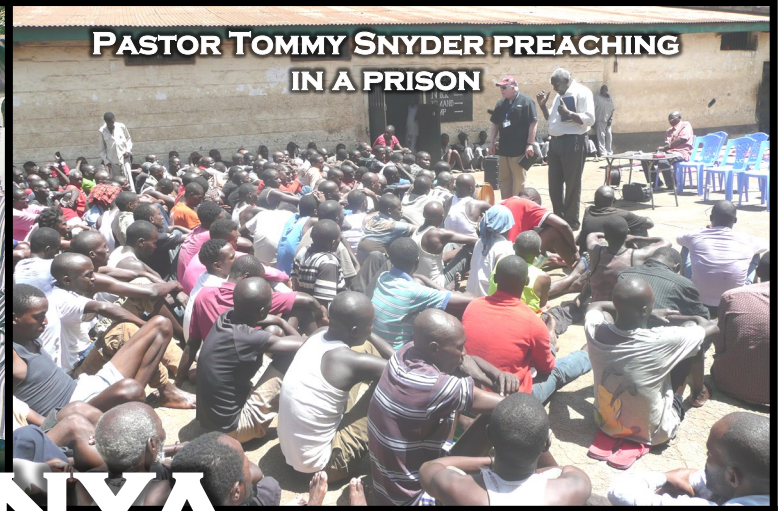

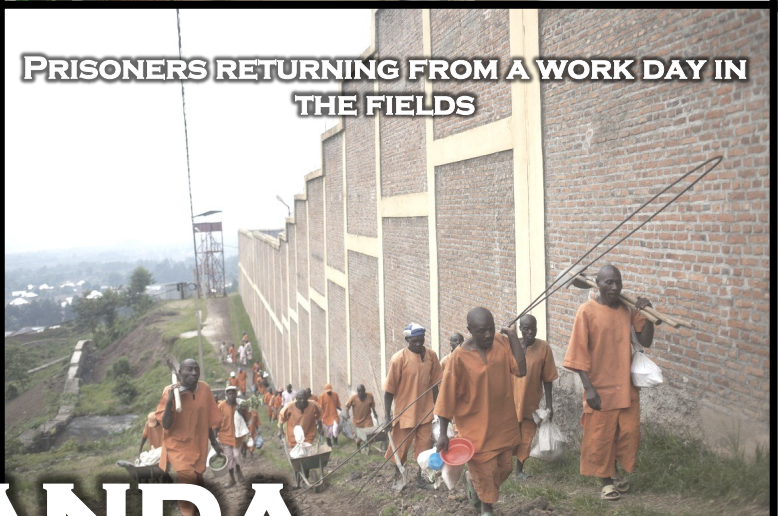

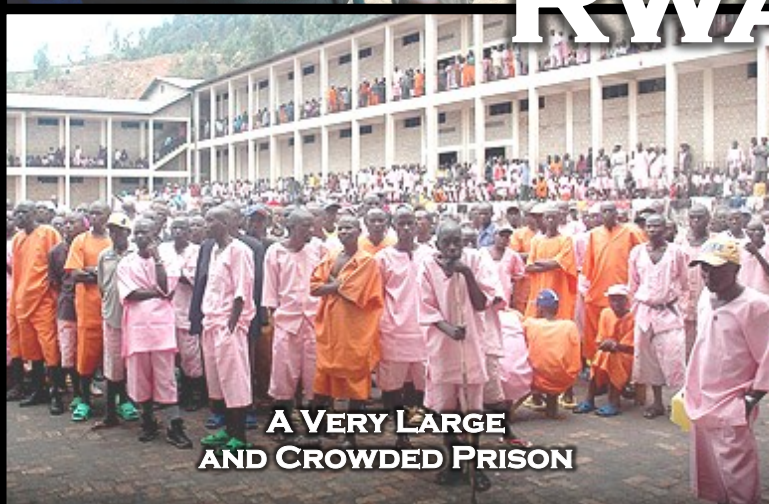

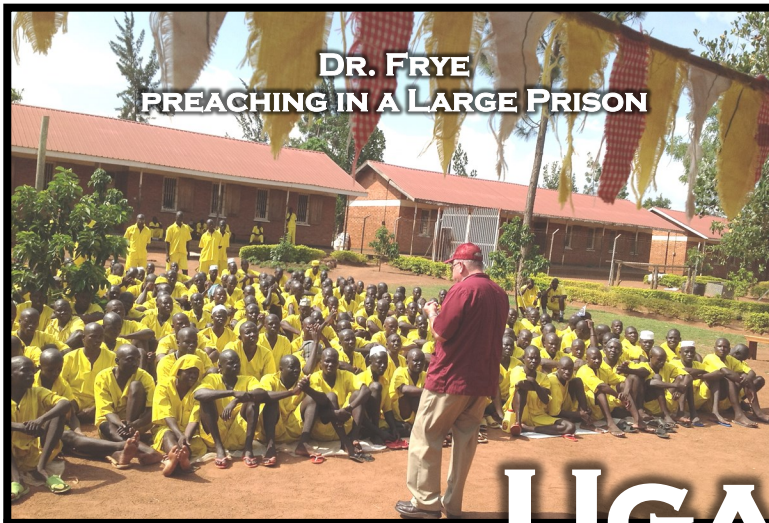

Most of you know that for many years I have had some major health problems. There have been the heart problems with open heart surgery back in 2010. Since then, I have had five more heart catheterizations with four stents in my arteries. Then, back in 2011, I came down with the incurable lung disease called bronchiectasis which the doctors believe I contracted from an airborne fungus in Africa. But, thank God, He healed this disease in 2013. In addition, for many years I have been a diabetic which requires me to take a lot of shots every week. I am also on medication for high blood pressure and several other problems. I tell you this because I do want to request your prayers for my health, but also, that God will give me wisdom in planning our work, planning our trips, and in knowing just how much He wants me to attempt to do with all of these difficulties.

Of course, I would not be where I am today, were it not for my wonderful wife, Jo Anne. She has truly been the greatest preacher's wife that any man of God could ever have had. So, please pray for her and her health as well so that both of us might continue to work as a team for as long as God will allow us to do so.

I would like to ask that you help us pray about when to make trips to Africa, but also, about when to make long trips here in America. When we were young, all of this travel was not so difficult, but now days it requires much more. I would like to ask you to pray that God will give us discernment every day on what comes next.

Then, I would like to ask all of you pastors and churches to really pray that God will give us wisdom on what new doors to walk through, where we can get the most accomplished by winning the most souls to Christ, and how to be more fruitful in everything we do.

And, as I mention praying for wisdom about walking through open doors, I also want to ask you to help me pray about my ministry of writing and trying to get the Gospel message out through the written page. Even when my voice is not good, I can at least put the truth of the Gospel on paper and try to share it with a lost world. So, I would like to ask you to really help me pray about even enlarging our newsletter to provide some wonderful help for pastors, churches, and individual American Christians as well. I want this enlarged newsletter to be a great tool of assistance for every child of God, but especially, those who love winning

people to Christ through world evangelism and world missions. Therefore, we need your prayers about this new step toward getting out the Gospel in even a greater way.

A Great Big Thank You To Bethlehem Baptist Church!

It only stands to reason that this wonderful GIMI Ministry would not be possible were it not for faithful individual contributors, and the many pastors and churches that support this work. One of those very faithful churches is Bethlehem Baptist Church in Old Fort, North Carolina where Brother Charles Hughes is the dear pastor. This church has been so gracious to help GIMI for many years; and yet, they do this although they are not a huge church.

I do want to share with you that Bethlehem's VBS leaders, Samantha Wyatt and Rebecca Marlowe, just did a fabulous job in preparing for this VBS, and they gave a tremendous presentation of God's Word to the children and youth during the week. Then, on Friday evening, my dear wife and I were invited to attend the VBS Family Night. When we arrived that evening, there were 125 people present for this special event, and when I preached and gave the invitation, 21 people prayed to receive Christ, and 16 of these came forward to confess Jesus as their Savior and Lord. The presence of God was so real and powerful, and when the Gospel was presented, God convicted the hearts of children, youth and adults. Two adults prayed the sinner's prayer with me, and then, the others were young people and children. I must tell you that it has been a long time since Jo Anne and I have experienced a service like this in America. Truly God has His hand upon this small rural church called Bethlehem Baptist. We will never forget this wonderful evening.

Also, I want to add that during those five days of Bible School, the children and adults raised \$1,050.00 to be sent to Shiperooy Christian School in the slums of Kampala, Uganda to help provide school supplies for Headmistress, Mable Sumujju, and her precious school children. Then too, Samantha and Rebecca were able to get 10 used computers given to Shiperooy. We will be sending these computers to the children in Uganda very soon.

So, we are just thanking God for the Bethlehem Baptist Church, under the leadership of Pastor Charles Hughes and his dear wife, Alice. Thank you Lord for blessing the efforts of all of the people at this wonderful church. What a privilege it was for Jo Anne and myself to share in this special occasion.

Oh, The Struggle With Changes We Have To Constantly Make!

If you are a senior citizen, then you are very much aware of the fact that everyday is truly a challenge. The problem is that our bodies don't want to keep up with our minds. As I mentioned in the previous paragraphs, we have a struggle almost daily trying to discern what trips we should plan, and what changes may have to be made at the last minute.

For instance, most of you know that Jo Anne and I planned to go to Kenya and Uganda earlier this year to do a lot of work in these two beautiful countries. We have been working there in these two countries for 35 years. But then, my health took a turn for the worse, and I requested that our GIMI Vice-president go to Kenya in our place to preach in the prisons and schools. He very graciously did this. He saw a wonderful harvest of souls. Then, after those two weeks in Kenya, my son, Pastor Joel Frye and singer, Bart Grant, graciously agreed to go to Uganda in our place. There they preached and shared the Gospel, with almost 3,000 getting saved. Jo Anne and I are so grateful for what these three men of God did for us.

Well now, after working for days on a plan for us to make another extensive trip to six African countries this coming September and October, Jo Anne and I are being forced to rearrange another trip with the help of Pastor Tommy Snyder, Pastor Rick Via, and one of Tommy's deacons in the First Baptist Church of Batesville, MS. The deacon's name is Randy Willis. These three men have volunteered to go in my place to Zambia, South Africa and conduct a four evening outdoor crusade at a large soccer field in the town of Chingola. During the morning hours, they will be conducting a Pastors' and Church Leaders' Seminar for three hundred pastors who are connected with the Bethel Mission, a group of over 300 churches and pastors. In this big seminar, Pastor Tommy and these other brethren will be teaching some seminar material which I have written, entitled, "Some Characteristics Of Great Leaders". Please pray that God will give Tommy and his team a great harvest of souls in the crusade and a successful seminar for the church leaders.

Now, you probably want to know why I have decided not to go to Zambia at this time. Truthfully, I have had a few additional health problems which have caused Jo Anne and myself to be a little concerned about going to a new country where we don't know any of the government leaders and medical personnel. So, rather than attempting a six nation trip, we have decided to spend our seven weeks, September 15—October 29, in Kenya and Uganda. But, we will be bringing a lot of our GIMI nationals and staff to Uganda for a two-day training seminar. Please pray that God will provide the necessary

funds for this much needed expedition. **I would also like to ask many of you to consider giving some extra funds for the big crusade in Zambia because GIMI is responsible for raising the funds for this entire endeavor. The projected cost for this crusade and the seminar is just over \$8,000.** We will sincerely appreciate whatever you might be able to do to help bring the possibility of this huge harvest to fruition. It is projected that Dr. Tommy may have 15,000—20,000 people in attendance each evening during the crusade. Can you get excited about this? I surely am, and also somewhat jealous, because I will not be able to participate. But, we will just carry out what God provides the strength and wisdom for Jo Anne and me to do during this old age!

A Huge Challenge Before Us With 54,000 South Sudanese In A Ugandan Refugee Camp

In our last newsletter, I shared with you the enormous burden that God has placed on my heart for the huge South Sudanese Refugee Camp in northern Uganda. It has over 54,000 people there just struggling to stay alive and to meet the needs of their children every day. You may remember that I told you that 86% of the people in this camp are women and children. A lot of the fathers and older brothers have been killed in the civil war across the border in their home country of South Sudan. This civil war has been going on since 2011. We have heard much talk about peace being restored, but so little has been done to bring this about.

I am happy to tell you that for the past two months, due to the sacrificial giving of several people, we have begun our evangelism and humanitarian ministry in this large camp. Our Uganda Pastor, Patrick Ogaba, and our South Sudanese Pastor, Mogga Leju, have been working diligently in the camp, and my, how God is working in this new project. During the first month, we have distributed a huge amount of soap, ladies' hygiene products, some food, some medicine, and a lot of Bibles. Also, we are praising the Lord for over 200 people who have gotten saved, some of which came from false religions.

We are including several photos in this newsletter from the camps. I hope you will look at them, pray for these dear people, and then hopefully, God might lead you to help with some extra gifts to this work. Some of you have already helped us, and for this, we are so very grateful. In fact, some of you have given very sacrificially toward this endeavor. It is our prayer that God might reward you richly because of your investment in these suffering people who so desperately need Jesus. We are hoping to work in the camp at least through the end of this year, and hopefully, possibly, into 2020 as well. I see no greater opportunity anywhere to win so many people to Christ more than through this special project! I hope you can help us!

By Faith, We Are Going To Resume Our Radio Broadcasts!

Now, as I come to the close of this newsletter article, I just want to mention something that truly excites me, but yet, it is going to be quite a challenge. Most of you probably remember that just over two years ago, we were producing a weekly 30 minute radio broadcast on 17 different stations around and over our country. Then, along came some very difficult health problems, including worsening diabetes, my daily heart problems, and several other things and because I was still pastoring a church and preaching and teaching four times per week, I decided to stop the broadcast. However, during those two plus years that we were on the radio, God had given us a rather large radio audience. Many people let me know how much they really enjoyed the presentation of the Word of God which we did.

Well, after a tremendous amount of prayer, and because God has opened some tremendous doors for us again, I feel it is God's perfect will for us to restart our radio broadcast once more. Just recently, the Wilkins Radio Network has offered us a tremendous proposal to restart our broadcast on 35 of their radio stations all the way from Greenville, S.C. to California in the west, Pittsburgh in the northeast, down through Alabama up into Indiana, out to Richmond, VA, and in many other areas. In addition, we are hoping to be on some other stations that we used to be on here locally in North Carolina, in Tennessee, up in West Virginia, and hopefully, back on several stations in Africa. By the time we get everything up and going again, we should be on 40 plus stations as we preach and teach the Word of God, and as we share with the world the growing story of Gateway International Missions. Truly, this is a story that needs to be told, and this radio renewal should open many doors for more people to get involved in our mission work, including, hopefully, some new contributors who will help support the radio outreach, and also, the entire ministry of GIMI. Our radio broadcast will be named once again, the Gateway International Missions Radio Broadcast. We are going to include in this newsletter a list of the stations that we will start out on the first weekend in this month of July. I do plead with you to really pray for this renewed endeavor, for the funds to pay for the radio broadcasts, and especially for the problem that I have experienced with my voice for quite a long time. I will be recording the broadcast in our GIMI Radio Room here at our headquarters, and if I do have some problems with my voice, I will get some other

preachers to help us record the broadcasts from time to time.

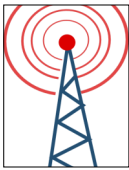
And one more note! If any of you could or would help us financially by designating some gifts to the radio ministry, we would be so very grateful. We are excited about this renewed effort because we have seen the fruit from this ministry in the past.

For instance, several years ago on a Saturday morning in Uganda, a Kuwaiti man was in his car coming out of Kampala, Uganda. He was deep in depression, and he was heading to the Nile River to end his own life. Well, the Nile River is just about 60 miles from the capital of Kampala. During his drive to kill himself on this particular Saturday morning, as God would have it, he turned on his radio to the station we were on in Jinja, Uganda, and at the end of the broadcast, I invited the people who were listening to stop their cars if they were driving, pull over, and pray the sinner's prayer with me. That very day, this dear man got gloriously saved! He made his way to the local radio station. There he told the people about how he had just gotten saved and that God had not only saved his soul, but God had also saved his physical life that very morning. So, do we think the radio ministry is worthwhile? Yes, I would say that we do. Therefore, if you could indeed pray daily for the radio ministry, and if you could help us some financially to pay for the airtime, we would forever be grateful. I know that God's Kingdom will be blessed because we will declare His Word every week on the broadcast!

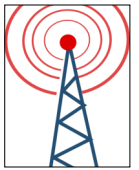
