
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Dear Beloved Friends and Supporters of GIMI,

Criswell, Dr. R.G. Lee, Dr. Jerry Vines, Dr. David Gallamore, Dr. Stephen Olford, Dr. Paige Patterson, Dr. Kenneth Ridings, Dr. John Rymer, and many others just like these great servants of God. A lot of these precious men, whom we should continue to pay tribute

to, are either sick or older. Many have already gone on to heaven to be with the Jesus. But, please name one preacher of this generation who should be placed in the category of these mighty men of God. I sincerely don't know of one!

The churches of today are led by arrogant professing preachers self-centered who accept homosexuality, like the present President of the Southern Baptist Convention, J.D. Greer, or like Al Mohler, who is a predominant Hyper-Calvinist negatively influencing millions of people across our land. Because of this false doctrine of election, many people are dying and going to hell because the churches don't see any need for great soul-winning and outreach programs. You see folks, if I were lazy, the main doctrine I would believe is predestination and election. We have huge amounts of preachers who would rather sit at home and enjoy their weekly salaries, play golf, or go fishing for fish while the lost world dies and goes to hell. But, why should we go after the lost if those predestined from before the creation of the world are just going on to hell regardless of whether we try to win them to Christ or not?

And now, we have numbers of so-called servants of God who walk to their pulpits/platforms every week wearing blue jeans with their legs showing through the holes, tight t-shirts with some kind of slogan on them, gym shoes or possibly sandals with their naked feet showing, and other ridiculous outfits. These men and yes, some uncalled women, who pretend to be great pastors, just make a mockery out of the place they stand in trying to teach a message with very little truth, and certainly one with no conviction of sin. These charlatans are able to draw in thousands of people with their entertainment, cute jokes, and successful destinies jargon, but yet, these people only give the love side of the Gospel with no presentation of the need for repentance. Thousands and thousands of people are being deceived by the "health and wealth gospel" with every message on grace, but they rarely ever mention the ugliness of sin and the need for true repentance and righteous living. Dietrich Bonhoffer, a great preacher in Nazi Germany, said many years ago that when we try to avoid the requirements of the law and only talk about grace, then grace becomes a law unto itself. Because of this great man's devotion to God, he was hanged by Adolph Hitler's thugs. And yet, this is what we are seeing all around us today. We are hearing so much about grace, but we rarely hear anything about conviction, repentance, sanctification, and righteous living. And yet, there can be no intimacy

with the living Christ without righteous living. Therefore, is it any wonder that our churches are now in the mess that they are in? Is it any wonder that 68 percent of the men in churches today are hooked on pornography?

Also, I stand utterly amazed at how these so-called modern, cool preachers can take in millions and millions of dollars from their people or through their radio, TV, and Internet audiences, but they rarely spend much of anything proportionately on evangelism and world missions. For instance, while Joel Osteen's net worth is over 60 million dollars and his church budget is 90 million dollars annually, he and his church only spend \$1.2 million annually on world missions and outreach. This makes me extremely angry with righteous anger. Also, Joel lives in a 17,000 sq. ft. house that is worth 10.5 million dollars, and he makes no apology for living this way.

Folks, when I see this foolishness, I get very upset with these charlatans. I say this because just last week, GIMI sent \$1,000 to one of our prison preachers in Uganda to buy metal sheets so that he can build a two-bedroom house for himself, his wife, and their six children. I got extremely burdened about this when I saw a picture of him standing outside of his present hut with his family, while presently the door on his house is merely a cloth. Now, if I have offended some of you dear believers because I hate ungodly stewardship and regular neglect of God's people around the world, please forgive me. But truthfully, I am having difficulty accepting some of this terrible merchandising of the Gospel. Do you remember what Jesus said? "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head." (Luke 9:58) You see folks, Jesus came into this world in a stable, lived with peasants in Nazareth, worked from place to place all over Judea and Galilee, with no regular house, died innocently on a cross, which should have been for Barabbas, and then was buried in a borrowed tomb. So, the Joel Osteens, the Steven Furticks, the Kenneth Copelands, the Benny Hinns, the Roger Grays, the Joyce Meyers, the T.J. Jakes, the Creflo Dollars, the Jentezen Franklins, and scores of other charlatan preachers will have to answer to God for their flamboyant ministries and lifestyles while almost three billion lost people in the world have yet to hear the simple presentation of the plan of salvation and that Christ loved them so much that He died for them on the cross and arose from the dead to give every believer eternal life. While the majority of the people in the world are dying and going to hell without Christ, especially during this

wretched coronavirus time, these false preachers are living better than kings and queens while showing almost no concern, except for a few of their pet projects.

There Must Be A Heart Cry For Revival!

Oh yes, I believe strongly in the imminent return of Christ and the Pre-tribulation Rapture, but I do sincerely believe that God would love to send genuine revival to His people in order to reap a huge harvest of souls just before He returns, if we will cry out for revival and ask God to pour out His Holy Spirit on our lives as believers and also, on our churches. We need to stop playing church, which the coronavirus has escalated, and we need to get on our faces before God and cry out for a manifestation of His mighty power and grace.

Many years ago, I discovered a great book on revival written by Dr. Stephen Olford, who has now gone on home to be with Jesus. The title of this great book is "A Heart Cry For Revival". This is one of the greatest books on revival that I have ever read! The title of the book reveals the content, which talks about how if we are to have genuine revival, we must fervently pray from a burdened heart for genuine revival. This is truly what we must do during these horrible days. If we will cry out to God and pray for personal and collective revival, and then, repent of our sins and confess Christ as the Lord of our entire lives, God will answer our prayers as He has promised to do in II Chronicles 7:14, where he states, "If my people, which are called by my name, and shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." Truly, this is a great promise from our wonderful God. But, the problem is as Dr. A.W. Tozer used to say, "God is much more ready to send revival than we are to obey for revival." I believe this is still true today! If you don't believe this, just stop and look at how many people on our church membership rolls are using this horrible virus to give them an excuse

for not even trying to worship together. While many believers are attending socially distanced worship services, while others are providing live streaming of the services, and while others are providing worship services in their automobiles, at least one third of the church family is participating in absolutely nothing! I know this from talking with some pastors, by watching worship services on line, and by some articles I have been reading. Now, some of you who are living in horrible fear think that I am crazy. But the truth is that although we must be careful, there are scores of church members who just use this horrible plague as an excuse to stay at home and do nothing. Maybe one of these delinquent church members might be reading this newsletter! Yes, we have to be extremely careful, and I know this because I just conducted the funeral of a fine 47 year-old husband and father that I used to pastor. But, we must understand that many of these so-called politicians who try to keep the churches closed and keep people from worshipping are under the control of Satan. Our Governor here in North Carolina is one of these wicked politicians who truly wants to close the churches. "A Cry For Personal Revival By A Fallen King" Scripture: Psalm 51

Introduction

I would now like to address this great subject of revival in a very in-depth way. I am very afraid that in this secular world and complacent church age, very few people know anything about genuine revival. I have never experienced a nation-wide revival in my almost 73 years of life, but I can tell you that I have seen some tremendous movements of God through my almost 55 years of ministry as a preacher, pastor, evangelist, and missionary. I have seen revival break out in some of the more than 1,000 revival meetings, which I preached in as an evangelist. As a pastor, I have seen God move in some inexplicable ways in bringing hundreds and hundreds of people to the Savior. Therefore, I am begging God to start in my personal life and in our American conservative Bible-believing churches. Of course, in the liberal churches, there can't be revival because lost people can't have revival, but they can have regeneration and transformation as the Holy Spirit of God moves in. I am praying for our wonderful Savior to bring a transformation and a resurrected rejuvenation in all of our churches before we capitulate to the demise of this great nation.

Truly, if we will just take an objective look today at what is going on in our country with scores of lying politicians, the angry Christ-hating mob that wants to destroy our entire society and the weak-kneed politicians on both sides of the political aisle who will not stand up for anything conservative and good because they want to placate and appease the powerful lobbyists in the entire government of our counties, our states, and in Washington, D.C. We truly have the greatest mess I have ever witnessed in all of my life! But, there is still hope if every believer at the bottom all the way up to the top will fervently pray, repent of his or her sin, and ask God to heal our land. This is the only hope that we have in these final days before the return of Jesus.

In order to show you how to pray for revival, I would like to use the repentant prayer and confession of a tremendously great and well-known king in Israel, King David, who many years ago sinned terribly against God and then, tried to cover up his sin of sexual immorality by murdering the husband of his mistress and lying to cover up these horrible sins. But, when he thought no one else knew, God knew, and God sent Nathan the prophet to rebuke the king and demand that he repent. This story is found in **II Samuel 12**! David had tried to cover up his sin for an entire year, but when God's preacher confronted him, he cried out to God in **Psalm 51** and repented of his sin. He cried out for revival, and I pray that David's plea might be the example that all of America follows in crying out to God for revival. Now, let's look closely at this Scripture expositionally.

I. PLEASE NOTICE THE PREREQUISITE FOR PERSONAL REVIVAL: CONFESSION OF OUR SIN! vs. 1-6

A. In his confession, David faced the Recipient of his sin. v. 1

It is very obvious in this verse that king David readily confessed to God that his terrible sin was indeed against the God of mercy and loving-kindness. Therefore, David pleaded with this great God of tender mercy to please blot out his transgressions.

May I tell you that this is the place for each of us as believers to begin. We must admit that God has been sinned against, and we must ask God to forgive us. You see folks, David may have sinned against Bathsheba's husband and family, but his worst sin was against the kind loving God.

B. In his confession, David faced the reality of his sin. vs. 2-3

I would like to tell every one of you readers that the place for all of us to begin is in telling God that we are indeed guilty, and then, begging for His forgiveness.

1. David's sin was real because of its depth. v. 2

In his confession, David told God that his sin was so severe that he needed to be washed thoroughly because he was filled with the stench of the wrong he had done. In fact, the word used here in the Hebrew is the word "avon", and it had to do with perverse. Can you just imagine that this great king of Israel confessed to God that the cause of his terrible sins was because of the perverseness of his heart? My, when was the last time you heard one of God's children in your church admit how perverse his or her heart was because of the sin he or she had committed. Can you see that the guilt of David's sin was all over him? Truly, he cried out for God to cleanse him thoroughly. I want you to see just how overwhelmed David was with the chastisement or punishment, which God had brought to David because of his sin.

There are many scholars that believe that **Psalm 38** is also a confession of David because of this sin, and if so, and I believe it is also, this additional Psalm reveals that obviously David had possibly contracted a sexual disease from his sin with Bathsheba, or maybe from other illegitimate relationships with other women. But, based upon his confession in both of these Psalms, it may have indeed come from Bathsheba. I am inclined to believe that just maybe Bathsheba had done this horrible thing before. Why? Because of the way she immediately responded to David's request!

Whatever the disease was, and how ever serious the matter had become, David had had enough and wanted God to forgive him. This, my friends, is the way we should come to Jesus and say, "I have had enough of this sinfulness, and I beg you to forgive me." But why should we confess our sins? Because all of our unrighteousness has contributed to the horrible conditions that our nation is in right now!

2. David's sin was real because of its dreadfulness. v. 3

The word transgressions in verse 3 is a strong word that David uses, because in fact, he is telling God that he was confessing his terrible rebellion against the God who had placed him in the position of the king of God's chosen nation. Obviously, the guilt of his sin was bothering him both day and night. In truth, when he got up in the morning, the guilt was there. Then, when he went to bed at night, he lay awake contemplating his horrible rebellion against God. His sin was dreadful, and if we are going to have God to divinely intervene in our lives and yes, even in our churches and nation right now, we too must cry out for God to not only forgive us of our sin, but we must appeal to the Lord to take away the continuous guilt we are facing. But, we need to remember that we will never get out from under our guilt, until we first admit that we have rebelled against God.

C. In his confession, David faced the repulsiveness of his sin. v. 4

1. David's sin brought pain to the heart of God. v. 4a

Well folks, now David gets very serious about his desire for cleansing. In this verse, David literally confesses that although he had sinned against his family and the entire family of Bathsheba, including killing her husband, the most terrible thing was that this God-chosen man had broken the very heart of the God that gave him his kingship. In other words, David confessed that he knew he had brought much pain to the heart of God. What a terrible way to treat the One Who had given him everything after He brought him from the shepherd's field and placed him on the throne as the king of Israel.

2. David's sin was going to bring punishment from the hand of God. v. 4b

After admitting and confessing his horrible sin, David reaches the point to where he tells God that however He chooses to punish him for what he had done would be justified. If God chose to rebuke him privately or publicly through a prophet of God, David was ready to accept this rebuke because he in fact deserved it.

Let me just tell all of you readers that we will never see God answer our prayers and send revival until we are ready to confess that whatever God does to chastise us is quite alright. There never will be grace and mercy shown until we reach this point in our confession. You see folks, when we get totally and completely honest with God about how regretful we are about our rebellion toward our loving God, we will never experience the

forgiveness of God, and we will not see God show up in powerful revival in our hearts or even in our nation. God is much more ready to send revival then we are to confess just how our individual sins have produced the need for revival. My dear friends, this is a very serious matter, and we must never take our sins lightly because truly they do bring pain to the heart of God! No believer will ever get serious about repentance and begging for God to forgive him or her, until he or she acknowledges the hurt that comes to the heart of God because of their rebellion.

D. In his confession, David faced the reason for his sin. v. 5

Well now, as we look at verse 5, we recognize a very important truth. In his confession to God, David just tells God that he understands that he has an Adamic nature of sin and that every person born on this earth is born with this fallen nature. David knew that when he came forth from his mother's womb that he already possessed the sinful nature. Thus, he knew why he had fallen again into sin, and he was not trying to excuse or cover up his sin. Let me tell you that this truth must be understood by every person who ever expects to be born again, and every person that will be victorious in overcoming the temptation of Satan. Therefore my friends, we all have the same problem of original sin, but this doesn't give us an excuse to keep on sinning because when Jesus died on the cross for our sin, *"He who knew no sin became sin for us that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him."* (II Corinthians 5:21)

E. In his confession, David faced the remedy for his sin. v. 6

In this verse, David tells the Lord that he knew that God desires for every person to live with a desire for truth in his or her inward parts, and that it is only God that can give us wisdom to face temptation and be victorious over it. It seems that David is just telling the Lord that he knows how to be victorious over sin, but that he had stumbled and forgotten to appropriate the victory.

Folks, there is a tremendous lesson here for us. If we are going to pray for personal revival like David did, then we must admit that because we have been saved and Christ already lives within us, we already have access to the power of God to be victorious over temptation. In other words, it is a matter of making the right choices to overcome the attacks of Satan. The point is that if we fail to be victorious over temptation, then we can blame no one but ourselves. And surely, this is one of the main reasons we are not experiencing revival today. No one will admit any wrong or any mistakes, but instead, they live in a fantasy world of blaming everyone else for their sins. I find nowhere in this Psalm that David blamed Bathsheba for the sin of adultery, which they both committed. If we are truly serious about praying for revival, then we must readily confess and admit that we are guilty before God for our own sins, and yes, even for the fact that our sins and negligence have contributed to the decline of our churches and nation.

II. PLEASE NOTICE THE PROCESS OF PERSONAL REVIVAL: CLEANSING FROM OUR SIN. vs. 7-12

As we move on with this in-depth exposition of David's cry for personal revival, we see this fallen king begging God for a personal spiritual cleansing of his personal being. David knew that he would never be able to walk with God like he had in the past until he was truly forgiven and genuinely cleansed from his sin. In these next verses, I see no hypocrisy or pretention in David, but I do see a completely honest man who knew emphatically what he had to receive from God. Let's now look at some valuable points about David's prayer for cleansing.

A. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's defilement. v. 7

As we look carefully at verse 7, we discover some fabulous truth about David's personal cry for revival. David mentions the desire to be purged with the little shrub called hyssop, which was used in the Jewish temple of worship to apply the blood and the water in the cleansing ceremony. Of course we as New Testament believers know fully well that when Jesus died on the cross to take our sins away, Christ also not only washed our sins away, but He also took our guilt away. You see, when hyssop was used in the Jewish sacrificial ritual, the symbolic

representation of the hyssop was that not only would the individual's sins be forgiven, but that God also would remove the guilt for those sins. What King David was pleading for in his prayer for personal revival was that God would not only forgive the terrible sins he had committed, but that God would also give David freedom from the condemnation and guilt of his sin. David's cry to God was, "God please take my sins away and wash me thoroughly from all my sins, but also, please take the guilt away so that I don't have to live in bondage and personal condemnation because of the sins that I have committed." David's entire life had been defiled by the sins he had committed, and so are ours if we don't repent, confess our sins, and ask God to restore us to walk in holiness with Him.

B. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's deafness. v. 8

In this verse, David sincerely begs God to bring back the joy and gladness, which he had lost. The way David phrases this indicates that because of his horrible sins, he had been isolated from his friends and neighbors, and he had lost the wonderful sounds of laughter and gladness. So, this is exactly what unconfessed sin does in the life of any believer. This unconfessed sin takes away the joy and gladness, and it will definitely result in sorrow and a feeling of broken-heartedness. Truly, one of the worst places on earth that a believer in Christ can be is when because of his or her unconfessed sin, all of the joy in life is gone, and this guilty soul becomes isolated from his or her family and friends. So, David cries out for the sound of joy and gladness. May I ask you, "Have you lost the joy of the Lord because of some unconfessed sin in your life?" If you have, today is the day to cry out to God for personal revival!

C. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's disgrace. v. 9

As we continue to look into David's cry for personal revival, we now come to verse 9, where David appeals to God to please stop looking on his sin and disgrace. It was the light of God's radiant face that exposed David's sin and shame. So, David cried out to God to please turn His face away from his sin. David felt so ashamed because of his terrible sins. The truth was that David would never be able to walk freely before his people after the terrible sins he had committed, unless God would forgive his sins, and yes, no longer convict him over what he had done. David was so ashamed of what he had done before God and all of the Israelites. Just remember that David at one time killed Goliath with a sling, and now, after being anointed as the king of Israel, he had gravely sinned before God and the people. Thus, David could not bear the horrible guilt and shame. So, he appealed to God to turn His face away from David because the king could no longer stand the shame and embarrassment.

In the last part of this verse David once more cries out to God for forgiveness, and he boldly asks God to blot out his embarrassing shame from the book of God's record of mankind's sins. David was desperate, and he was so ashamed of what he had done that he just couldn't stand the shame any more. Please remember that this was King David who had been appointed by God Almighty to be the king of God's chosen people. And now, he was a brokenhearted, ashamed man because of the liberty he took to sin against God. David committed lust, which led to adultery. Then, he had Bathsheba's husband killed in battle to try to cover up his sin. After this, he took Bathsheba to become another one of his wives. Through his intimacy with Bathsheba, a baby was born and then died. Therefore, David's horrible sins had brought disgrace to him, to his family, to his friends, to his mighty kingdom, and most of all to God almighty, Who had chosen him to rule His people.

Dear readers, have you brought any shame to your family, friends, church family, or even to the God that saved you? If so, it is time to cry out to God for forgiveness and repent of your sins. We must have a heaven-sent revival if our nation is to stand. Therefore, let's not allow our unconfessed sin to be a hindrance to this great revival.

D. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's damage. v. 10

In this verse David asks God to "Create in him a clean heart; and renew a right spirit within him." This is truly one of the greatest verses in all of the Bible. David is begging God to give him a brand new clean heart. I believe this means that David was asking for new motives in his heart for living, and with these new motives, this king wanted to have, once more, the right attitude and actions. Truly, truly, this king of Israel knew where his sin began, in his heart, and he knew that for over one entire year, he had had a very negative attitude toward almost everyone because of his guilt and shame. It was now time for God to renew and restore the King David that the people had originally known.

Could I please tell you that because of the seriousness of David's sin being sexual immorality and murder, the king's life and testimony would never be the same again. Oh yes, God can and will forgive any sins that we have committed, but sometimes the sins have done so much damage and hurt to so many people that we can never go back to where we were before these grave sins were committed. Folks, we need to stop this erroneous belief that when God forgives us for our sins, that everything will be just "hunky dory" forever with nothing changed! I can tell you this that David's life was never the same after his sin, even though God did forgive him. Don't be a fool! Sin is always sin, but the results of our sin may be far different. Just ask any professing Christian inmate in a prison after he stole another man's wife and then killed her husband! For sure, David needed a clean heart, and so do we, if we would only confess our sins and guit blaming everyone else, like Adam Schift, Nancy Pelosi, and many more hypocritical politicians have been doing in Washington, D.C. for over three years. Folks, I don't know if President Donald Trump is really saved, but I do believe that like the Persian king Cyrus, who was a lost man who gave a decree for the Israelites to be permitted to return to Jerusalem after 70 years in captivity, God has brought Donald Trump to the Presidency to bring more tolerance of Christians and conservative families in America. I have never really told my congregations how to vote, but I do tell all of you people reading this newsletter that unless you want persecution for Christians and hatred for our conservative families, we need to oppose Joe Biden and his left-wing colleagues who are basically communists and hate God, the church, and every fully-committed believer. It is time for us to get completely honest about ourselves, our churches, and our country and cry out to God for genuine revival!

E. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's doom. v. 11

Verse 11 here in our text is a verse that describes the end result of personal sin in our lives, in our churches, and in our country, when we fail to admit the sin, cry our for forgiveness, and repent, turn around, and go in the opposite direction. In this verse David pleads with God to bring back His presence to David and to those around him. Now, most Christians know that in the Old Testament time before Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came down and filled all the believers, the Holy Spirit worked differently than He does today. Back then, the Spirit would come upon God's servants for special acts or duties, but He might leave them later. So obviously, when David sinned so defiantly against God, the Holy Spirit, Who always revealed the presence of God, left David, and David felt very alone. But thank God, we now live in the New Testament age when the Holy Spirit comes to baptize every new convert into the family of God at the moment of salvation, and the Spirit becomes the seal of salvation and never leaves the child of God. However, it is possible for a believer to sin so terribly that it seems God's Holy Spirit has forsaken a person, but, we know He doesn't. But our hearts and lives can become so sin-hardened that it seems He has left us. Friends, we have to be so careful about allowing sin to come to our lives, because if we do, the Holy Spirit may be seriously grieved and hurt to the point that it doesn't seem that He is with us at all.

So now, David was crying out to God to remove the feeling of doom and despair, which had come to him because of his great sin. As we will see shortly, David plunged into the depths of depression, and he was begging God to come back and make known His presence to the king. Again, I must say that Christians in this dispensation cannot have the Holy Spirit leave us, but if we tolerate sin in our lives, we can lose His warmth and sweet power to the point that it seems He has indeed left us.

F. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's depression. v. 12a

As we move just a little forward in our text, we have to see that David is begging God to restore the joy of God's salvation. David, as we studied earlier, was having a terrible time of depression because all the joy of knowing God had left him. And, we must always remember this, that when we allow sin to thrive in our personal lives, in our churches, or even in our nation, we are going to lose the joy of our intimacy with Christ. Maybe we

should right now stop and think about how much joy has left our great land because of the coronavirus, but also, because of the so-called protestors who have turned into blatant monsters who want to destroy everything about our past, our present, and yes, most assuredly about our future. I will tell you that I don't want to live without the joy of Christ in my life, in my family, in my church, in my community, and yes, even in our great nation. We must never forget the following verse. *"Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people."* (Proverbs 14:34).

G. David wanted the Lord to deal with sin's defeat. v. 12b

The last phrase in verse 12 is a broken heart crying out for release from despair and defeat. David pleads with God to bring back the free spirit that he had before he backslid into this sinful behavior. He not only wanted forgiveness for the sin and the wrong he had done, but he cried for God to restore the free spirit he had before his fall. Can I tell you that I too am one person that literally hates trying to live under the guilt and shame of any sin I have committed. When I commit some sin that brings back the emotional and spiritual bondage to my life, I just can't live under this curse of sin. Why? Because according to **Galatians 3:13**, Jesus took our curse at Calvary and made us free. Please notice this wonderful verse. "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree." It is the law that brings us to a knowledge of our sins, but it is the grace of God that sent Jesus to the cross which brings us deliverance from the defeat of sin. Notice another Scripture verse from II Corinthians 3:17, "Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty."

III. PLEASE NOTICE THE PRODUCTS OF PERSONAL REVIVAL: A CHANGE OF LIFE. vs. 13-19

As we continue this marvelous thought about experiencing real personal revival, we must now take a look at the evident products of genuine revival. These products include a genuine change of life. In this change, I am not talking about getting saved all over again, because we know that when we are once saved, we will always remain saved. But, the truth of the matter is that once a person, a church, a community, or even a nation has turned back on their commitment to God, there must be repentance and confession to reproduce a new direction of intimacy with Him. David learned this because we see it in these remaining verses 13-19. While David was spending his sinful life in a backslidden condition, there was no real fruitfulness in his life. Let me remind each of you readers that when we are living in a backslidden state, our lives become very unproductive as well. But, there is hope if we will really cry out to God to forgive our backslidden condition and send a renewal of our commitment to Christ. Let's take a look at the changes that took place in king David's life and discover what should happen in our lives when we have a renewed relationship with Jesus.

A. This changed life will produce an effective witness. v. 13

May I ask you readers how long it has been since you led some person to Christ? Or, maybe I should just ask how long it has been since you even did anything to try and bring people to the Savior? What we discover in verse 13 is that David states that once God sends revival to his life and restores the joy of His salvation, then David will be ready to teach other transgressors the ways of the Lord. I can assure you that during the twelve months that David was living in a sinful, guilt-ridden life, he was not able to affect any Jewish person's life in a positive way. By now, once he was restored in his relationship with God, he was now ready to make his witness to others a priority in his life. I am going to tell all of you readers of this newsletter that if a Christian, a pastor, or any other servant of God does not have on his mind what Jesus had on His, then, that person is living in sin out of God's perfect will. Why do I say this? Well, in **Luke 19:10**, we are told the following: *"For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost."* You see folks, the thing that Jesus always had on His mind and in His heart was the salvation of lost sinners. And, I must tell you that if you don't have lost souls on your heart on a regular basis if you really are genuinely saved, then you are living out of God's will, and probably living in sin, because the primary concern of truly saved people living in the perfect will of God is winning others to Christ. I don't buy these excuses that God is going to save whomsoever He chooses without our help. If this were true, the Great Commission would never have been given to the early disciples and to us as well.

B. This changed life will produce an enthusiastic worship. vs. 14-15

As I read these next two verses, truthfully, I just want to shout praises unto God. Why do I say this? Because David tells God that if He has taken away his guilt produced by living in a sinful backslidden way for over a year, he was ready to begin genuine worship with praise and singing unto the Lord. I would like to ask you to read the following commentary on these verses written by the late John Phillips. I beg you to get what this dear man of God said about the new change in David's life after he repented and got right with God.

"'Deliver me from blood guiltiness, O God, Thou God of my salvation: and my tongue shall show forth Thy praise.' David's lips had been sealed for a year. They had been sealed by his own stubbornness. He had set his jaw in defiance, glared back at the world, and refused to admit he had done anything wrong. After all, he was a king and could do as he pleased.

His lips had been sealed with shame, as well. A sense of his utter wickedness had pressed down upon him and he had kept his mouth shut. He knew that if he spoke about the things of God, the people would call him a hypocrite. But once the Lord set him free, he would be free indeed. Then, this new life of preaching and praising, of ministering to man and to God, would become the habit of his life."1

Therefore, my dear friends, do you enjoy going to church to worship God, even if your pastor has to be newly innovative during this time of the coronavirus? Have you followed the leadership of your dear pastor in order to make sure that you don't get cold toward God like David did? If you have not shown commitment and determination to continue to worship during these difficult times, don't you think you should confess your sin and ask God to restore you with a newly transformed change in your life that will cause you to desire to worship? Oh yes, I do understand why people that are living in sin out of God's will don't enjoy going for worship. If they are living in sin and go to worship, they will be brought under heavy conviction, and they will have to get right with God. Folks, I must warn you that if you have made no special attempt to continue to worship, then, you probably are now living in sin. You need spiritual revival with a restored fellowship with Jesus.

C. This changed life will produce an enlightened wisdom. vs. 16-17

Once more I want to share some more commentary from Dr. John Phillips. I do this because I want you to get the true significance of David's cry for revival. In these two verses we find the following comments. "It was a lesson of total guilt: *'For Thou desirest not sacrifice; else would I give it: Thou delightest not in burnt offering.*' David had committed both adultery and murder, both capital offenses under the Mosaic Law. David was guilty of presumptuous sin and no provision was made under the Mosaic Law for such sin. The law said: *'And the man who will do presumptuously...even that man shall die: and Thou shalt put away the evil from Israel'* (Deuteronomy 17:12).

David was nearly a thousand years before his time in his understanding of theology. It would take the Apostle Paul and the Epistle to the Romans to do justice to David's grasp of God's salvation. David knew instinctively that the Mosaic Levitical ritual code was a mere shadow. By faith David looked past the whole ritual system to God Himself. He was aware of his total guilt."²

In verse 17, we also discover that "David learned the lesson, too, of total grace: 'The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and contrite heart, Oh God, Thou will not despise.' When Nathan came with his parable, David flung himself in repentance and remorse at God's feet. The prophet looked at the sobbing king and said, 'God hath put away thy sin,' he said. That was total grace. No lamb, no ox, no sin offering, no trespass offering, no burnt offering. Just the Word of God!

David learned that day that what God really wanted from the sinner was a broken heart. That was the true sacrifice. The sin question was to be dealt with on spiritual, not ceremonial terms."³

The statement that God will not despise a broken and a contrite heart, simply means that God treasures those

who come to him in genuine regret and remorse over his or her sin. This broken spirit and contrite heart will truly bring revival. Please notice this next verse from Isaiah 57:15, "For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones." The point that I want to emphatically make here is this, "If we desire the divine wisdom of God, we must have a humble spirit and a contrite heart." Then, God will enlighten or illuminate His Word to bring forth truth and Divine wisdom. God sincerely loves His children that have broken spirits and contrite hearts. Maybe now, we can know why we go through so much suffering and even sometimes God's chastisement. David's sin brought about so much suffering for everyone concerned, but through his repentance and restoration, God gave him a teachable spirit as to what He characterizes as most important to the child of God.

D. This changed life will produce an encouraging word. vs. 18-19

Let me be quite simple with my comments on these last two verses. If we sincerely experience true spiritual revival, then we will be able to look ahead to much better times—even to the return of our Lord and the establishment of the Kingdom of God on earth during the millennial reign of Christ. David had suddenly come to realize that because of his repentance, God gave his people the encouraging word to look to the future. He also gave them the instruction that now after God's chastisement upon the king and also upon the nation, it was time to get back to work. I don't know for sure, and I certainly can't prove it Biblically, but I feel very strongly that during the one year after David had committed his terrible sins and probably was living under immense guilt, very little work for the nation of Israel was done. David had now repented of his sins, and he was admonishing his people to keep their eyes on the future, not only the immediate one, but also, on the future when the Messiah would return the second time and set up His millennial reign upon the earth.

May I tell you that I believe there is nothing in the entire world that should cause us to keep focused on the work to be done and the coming return of Christ like true heaven-sent revival. We need to pray that God will truly pour out His Spirit upon us as believers and upon our churches, which have become so lethargic and apathetic. There are millions of souls that still need to be saved. In order for us to keep sharing the Gospel, we need the dynamic movement of God's Holy Spirit to bring about genuine revival in the life of the believer, and yes, also in our churches. If God sends true revival, there will be a hunger among the people of God to take the Good News of Christ to a lost world!

Conclusion



I sincerely pray that God may have stirred your heart toward true repentance and confession of personal sin, like King David experienced. God sent revival to King David and Israel, and He surely wants to send revival in these last days just before the return of Christ. I challenge every one of you believers that get this newsletter to really examine your heart and see if you have the need for repentance. If you will all join me, we can truly see a mighty move of God!!!



WE ARE REVIVING GATEWAY INTERNATIONAL BIBLE COLLEGE ONCE AGAIN!

I believe that all of you readers who have been following the work of GIMI closely for the past several years know that a few years back we started the Gateway International Bible College to help equip God's servants to become greater men and women of God in His service. We had Thursday night classes here in our GIMI Headquarters Building with a maximum of nine students in class. However, we did eventually enroll over 40 students in Africa who worked with us on external classes—some faithfully and some not too faithfully. I have no doubt but that God led me to begin this Bible College, but with so many health problems, I eventually had to discontinue the courses and classes at my doctors' recommendation. So, we stopped the classes, but I haven't felt good about this ever since we did stop the college work. I am totally convinced that God wants us to help prepare His servants to preach and teach the Gospel, learn how to build churches, do Biblical counseling, learn to be spiritual leaders, and most of all, to get a genuine burden to win lost people to Christ. I am so burdened about this that sometimes I can't even sleep at night. Therefore, after much prayer, we are going to restart our Bible College work. But, we are going to change the methodology somewhat to help lighten my workload.

What we are going to do is to try to re-enlist all of our external students in Africa and here in America to get back to doing their FREE TUITION COLLEGE WORK! Instead of my trying to handle all of the incoming work as I did before, I am recruiting pastors here in America to help mentor these external students. Every student will be assigned his or her own mentor, and the student will work with this mentor until he or she graduates. I will oversee the entire operation and try to make sure that all of our mentors have the needed courses, syllabi, and other instructional materials ready for the work they will do with each student. I sincerely believe that this methodology will not only relieve me of a lot of my demanded workload, but it will also help to build strong relationships between the mentors and the students. Our GIMI Vice-President, Dr. Tommy Snyder, down in Mississippi, will be one of our mentors. Presently, I have some other seasoned pastors who are prayerfully considering helping with our new Bible College program.

For those of you who are within driving distance of

our GIMI Headquarters here in Taylorsville, NC, we are hoping to resume our Thursday night classes this fall, if we have enough students to enroll. If we don't get enough classroom students this fall, then we will start the spring classes in January 2021.

My dear beloved friends, I beg you to really begin praying for the presence of God's Spirit upon our new effort with GIBC. We need the wisdom and power of God, and we need to have God's people praying for our students, for our mentors, and for every financial need to be met. We have a tremendous desire to help these people that God has called to serve Him and to keep reaching out to lost souls in whatever time we have left before Jesus comes. Truly, "The fields are white unto harvest, but the laborers are few!"

If you know of any person who is interested in serving God in full-time or part-time service, please have them contact us about the possibility of their becoming one of our students at GIBC. We really would like to help them discover God's will for their lives and to help equip them to become all they possibly can be for Jesus and His Kingdom. Again, let me tell you that as long as we possibly can raise the funds, we are going to provide FREE TUTITION for all of our students! I really wish there would have been a GIBC with free tuition way back there when I went to the Bible College and Seminary. I remember those days going off to Fruitland Baptist Bible Institute with only \$2.00 in my pocket to buy a little gasoline for my 1952 Power-glide Chevrolet!
